



City School District of Albany 2010 Middle-Level Summer School

Middle-Level Summer School will be designed to increase the literacy and mathematical reasoning skills of students in English language arts, math, science and social studies through a team-teaching and cooperative model. Special-education instruction will be provided. There will also be a counselor on staff to provide additional social supports.

Parent and student academic notification occurred at the end of the first and second marking periods and continued throughout the remainder of the school year. Students who fail two or more courses will be recommended for summer school.

- **Location** – William S. Hackett Middle School, 45 Delaware Ave.
- **Dates** – Tuesday, July 6 to Friday, August 6
- **Registration** – Tuesday, June 29 and Wednesday, June 30
- **Classes** – 8:30 – 11:30 a.m. each day summer school is in session
- **Size of Program** – Approximately 150 students
- **Transportation** – All students outside of a one-mile radius will receive CDTA bus passes.
- **Attendance and tardiness** – Students will be dropped from summer school on the third unexcused absence and on the fourth late.
- **Discipline** – Any student who receives a disciplinary action risk being removed from the program.
- **Dress Code** – The following will be included in the dress code:
 - Be safe, appropriate and not disrupt or interfere with the educational process.
 - Brief garments such as tube tops, net tops, halter tops, spaghetti straps, plunging necklines (front and/or back) and see through garments are not permitted.
 - Underwear must be completely covered.
 - No wearing of hats or head coverings in the school building except for medical or religious purpose.
 - No clothing item that is vulgar or obscene.
 - No gang-related paraphernalia.
 - No clothing that promotes and/or endorses the use of tobacco or illegal drugs and/or encourages other illegal or violent activities.
- **Student Conduct Procedures Manual** will be developed by the summer school coordinator and distributed to all registrants and their parents. Parents will be required to sign a form acknowledging that he/she has read, understood and received a copy of the Student Conduct and Procedures Manual.
- **Student Orientation** – July 6
 - Prior to the start of class on July 6, all students will participate in an orientation session to review the rules and expectation for summer school.
