

PURPOSE OF THE STUDY

- □ Project grade-by-grade enrollments from 2020-21 through 2029-30, a 10-year period
- Analyze district's historical enrollments, birth and fertility rates, community population trends, demographic characteristics, and age structure
- Investigate historical enrollment trends with respect to race and poverty status in each school
- Investigate enrollment trends of resident students from Albany who are attending non-public schools
- Examine historical enrollments of resident students from Albany who are attending charter schools
- Research new housing starts and the impact on the school district


ALBANY HISTORICAL AND PROJECTED POPULATIONS 1900-2050




ALBANY DEMOGRAPHIC PROFILE

- □ 52% White, 23% African-American, 11% Hispanic
- □ 14% of population is foreign-born (Albany Co. = 10%). China and Pakistan are largest sources.
- Bachelor's Degree or Higher = 44%, same as Albany County
- Median family income = \$78K (Albany Co. = \$98K)
- Approximately 50,000 housing units, of which 60% are renter-occupied (Albany Co. = 42%).
- Median value of owner-occupied unit = \$190,000


ALBANY WHITE PERCENTAGE




ALBANY AFRICAN-AMERICAN PERCENTAGE




ALBANY HISPANIC PERCENTAGE

ELEMENTARY ATTENDANCE AREAS




HISTORICAL ENROLLMENT TRENDS

- District's 2019-20 enrollment (K-12, excluding PK) is 8,610. (PK-12 = 9,548)
- ☐ Enrollment peaked in 2017-18 (9,061) before declining by 451 students in last 2 years.
- □ Cohort-Survival Ratio Method (CSR) was used to project enrollments ten years into the future.


ENROLLMENT PROJECTION METHOD COHORT SURVIVAL RATIO

- □ Ratios are calculated for each grade progression. (Ex. 100 1st graders in 2018-19 become 95 2nd graders in 2019-20 = 0.95)
- □ Ratios above 1.000 = inward migration, below 1.000 = outward migration
- Survival ratios were computed for ten historical years.
- 11 of 13 average ratios were <u>below</u> 1.000 indicating net outward migration.
- 4-year averages were computed and used to project future enrollments.

HISTORICAL ENROLLMENTS (K-12) 2010-11 TO 2019-20




HISTORICAL ENROLLMENTS BY GRADE CONFIGURATION 2010-11 TO 2019-20




NON-PUBLIC SCHOOL ENROLLMENT

1,033 Albany resident students (K-12) attended non-public schools in 2019-20, representing 8.8% of Albany resident student population.






ENROLLMENTS BY RACE



ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED STUDENTS

- 4,842 students (57.7%) were economically disadvantaged in the school district in 2014-15
- 5,635 students (65.4%) in 2019-20, which is an increase of 793 economically disadvantaged students.

ECONOMICALLY DISADVANTAGED STUDENTS 2019-20




BIRTH COUNTS

- Births are used to project kindergarten students 5 years later.
- □ Births declined from 1,254 in 2005 to 1,049 in 2018 (-205).
- □ As a result, kindergarten counts have declined from 783 in 2013-14 to 631 in 2019-20.


HISTORICAL BIRTH COUNTS 2005-2018



PLANNED NEW HOUSING IN ALBANY

- Potential for 2,207 new housing units; majority are multi-family.
- 34% in Arbor Hill attendance area, 25% in Giffen attendance area, and 23% in Eagle Point attendance area.
- Using ESI statewide housing multipliers, 434 public school children (K-12) are projected.
- However, number is likely to be much lower as there are no Albany students in 649 recently-constructed units that were analyzed.

SUMMARY

- Enrollments (K-12) are projected to be lower at the end of the 10-year projection period.
 - 1. Declining birth rate
 - 2. Net outward migration of students
- Smaller kindergarten cohorts from declining births result in smaller elementary, middle, and, eventually, high school grades as they move through the system.
