On top of this, they know that building relationships is key to student success. They make time to really get to know our students and can often be seen giving them words of encouragement.

Social-emotional needs a priority

At NSES, we consider a student's social and emotional needs to be just as important as academics, and we will work to assure that all students have the support they need to succeed.

As we dive into educating children, it is extremely important for the adults at school to establish relationships with all of our students, and to recognize and support students' emotions. That is why we will continue with social-emotional lessons in our classrooms. Students will participate in classroom talks and activities around their social-emotional health. Some classes may even have a social worker in class for lessons.

Students will learn to recognize their own emotions, ways to de-escalate a situation when they are having a difficult time and how to help each other, creating a classroom community where students support and lift each other up.

Student voices, student leaders

Our mission at New Scotland Elementary School is to create a compassionate community of everyday leaders, giving each student a voice and encouraging every student to take control of their education.

Therefore, this year we will be creating a student leadership team. This leadership team will have representatives from each grade and our mission will be to give students a platform to improve the school experience for all students.

We will begin in September by electing a president, vice president and secretary from our fifth grade and we will work to identify an equity issue within our school or community to problem-solve. This leadership team will work with the school Equity Team and administration on equity issues as they arise during the year.

Students in all grades will have exposure to AVID through the teaching strategies utilized in our classrooms. AVID strategies are student-centered and students will be empowered to own their learning. AVID students are critical thinkers and goal setters who are organized, determined and self-motivated to learn and succeed. As a school we build these skills in our students so that they are prepared for college and careers when they continue their educational journey beyond New Scotland Elementary School.

Parent support is vitally important to your child's success. As mentioned in my August newsletter, my goal is to increase communication between school and home to

ensure you are well informed about what is happening at school. Our future newsletters will take on a similar format where I will include a section on grade level highlights.
